



## Winter Shelter/Warming Centers/Severe Weather Response Multnomah County

**Winter Shelter:** The Multnomah County Winter Response Services for Homeless Families expands the number of resources available for families during the winter months. The Winter Shelter services model provides nighttime shelter beds, day shelter services and housing placement services for Homeless Families (adults with children and women with medical verification of pregnancy). Shelter services in the winter are based on needs and available resources and are open from November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup> each year. Families staying in one of the Winter Shelters at night will also be referred to day shelters attached to these programs. **Warming Centers:** Multnomah County also sponsors two Warming Centers to assist homeless individuals and families with a warm and safe place to sleep during the winter months:

**Family-Focused Warming Center-Human Solutions, 1435 NE 81<sup>st</sup> (close to MAX)**

- Adults must have children under the age of 18; will accept pregnant women also
- Open 7pm-7am, seven days a week - No limit on length of stay
- Families access by showing up at 7pm. 6am is wake-up and families must leave by 7am
- Cots, bassinets, blankets and pillows, snacks as available, bathrooms, showers

**Adult Winter Warming Center-Transitions Projects, Check-in at 475 NW Glisan**

- Open to adult men, women and couples experiencing homelessness
- Access point is Transition Project's Community Service Center (CSC) at 475 NW Glisan
- Guest can sign up at the CSC daily from 8:30am-7:30pm and must confirm their space every night at 7:30pm
- Warming Center is located in NE, just across the Burnside Bridge
- No pets or carts permitted inside
- No smoking in facility and no smoke breaks during the night.
